Primary Function/Purpose:

The position has dual but complementary roles to support the decision-making of the ED and Board of Directors and support the implementation of agreed key Verde River watershed issues.

Reporting to the Executive Director (ED), the member will conduct programmatic analysis on behalf of the ED and Board of Directors to help inform their decision-making. Potential topics could include youth education, community science, habitat restoration, and water conservation. Research will be conducted both as a desk review of available material and with stakeholder consultations described below. The ED will provide mentoring support to the member in the development of these analyses. In addition, the member will conduct outreach to stakeholders in the Verde Watershed to gather information on stakeholder understanding of watershed issues, expectations for action, and feedback on FVR work. This information will help guide FVR work. Outreach work will be conducted in coordination with the ED who will provide mentoring support for these efforts. Finally, the member will assist the ED in the follow-up of agreed initiatives.

Contact with stakeholders: approximately 25 people regularly and 150 people on an occasional basis.

Qualifications:

- Technical degree preferred but should have a basic understanding of watershed issues
- Good oral and written skills
- Good interpersonal skills
- Willingness to travel in the watershed area and into the field when required.
- 30-hour plus work availability per week preferred. Workspace is a hybrid office/remote arrangement.
